ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Faculty members must provide a letter of support from their home institutions certifying support of their participation and must:

- + Teach at a Truck Driving program, a Heavy Equipment operations program, or an ASE or AED accredited Heavy Truck and Diesel Equipment Technician program;
- + Have at least two years of experience teaching Truck Driving, Truck/Diesel Repair Technician Technology, or Heavy Equipment Operation programs;
- + Agree to integrate new concepts related to ISA-TOPE technology into their curricula as a result of attending the PD activities;
- + Participate in follow-up activities to improve student learning, including sector meetings, discussing issues and/or successes in implementing the new technology into their curriculum, and sharing their experience with other colleagues;
- + Agree to report student demographics and impact data regarding the effects of the use of new materials for project reports; and
- + Participate in assessments of the project conducted by the external evaluator, e.g., interviews, surveys.
